About Results

Results International (Australia) is part of a global non-partisan movement of advocates working to improve global health and end poverty.

Results engages with decision-makers to build awareness of proven, cost-effective solutions to advance global health and end extreme poverty around the world. We work with members of parliament from all sides of politics and reach out to government officials and key leaders in development institutions. We train everyday people in our grassroots network to be confident Advocates and call for specific action from Australia's Federal Government. Our campaign focus is on building the political will in Canberra to end global poverty. At Results, we also provide resources and opportunities for our volunteer Advocates to make the case for global health in the media and community.

About the Global Health Fellowship Program

The Global Health Fellowship is a 6-month learning and volunteering opportunity for emerging leaders and campaigners.

Over 6 months, the Fellowship helps advocates aged over 18 years of age to harness the power of their voice, sharpen their policy skills, and take action with other dynamic Australians. Global Health Fellows learn how to work with policymakers to use evidence and push for change.

Join a movement committed to transformational change.

Global Health Fellows join a community of like-minded people from around the country and link in with global health advocates from around the world. Over the 6 months, Fellows attend skill development and learning sessions (mostly delivered online) and work together with other Fellows and staff from Results to collect evidence and develop a global health campaign, using skills developed through the program.

The Fellowship at a glance

- 6-month learning and volunteering opportunity for emerging advocates
- Through learning sessions and collaboration, Fellows develop knowledge of global health and policy, and skills to influence members of Parliament, senior officials in government, the media and the community.
- Fellows use skills to develop compelling advocacy material, and design and deliver a campaign.

Fellows will be supported with a bursary of \$1200 on completion of the Fellowship. Results will use outputs from Fellowship projects for advocacy and policy work throughout 2024 and 2025. In 2024, Results will support Fellows to deliver projects focussed on one of the following global health themes:

Innovations in Global Health	Working Together to Improve Health for Women and Children
<p>New technologies and investments in research and development (R&D) can be game changers when it comes to fighting diseases. This project will look at recent developments in testing, treatment and prevention and gather intel on game-changing innovations possible in the future.</p>	<p>Many of the most effective interventions in development are in women's and children's health. Immunisation programs and health support for mothers and their children provide a healthy start. This project will call for increased investments in key services for women, children and adolescents.</p>

Deliverables

Fellows will work with staff at Results to develop materials, create touch-points and design a campaign to build the political will for greater investments in global health. Fellows will work together to identify needs and develop advocacy materials, which may include:

- A report (with up-to-date data, footnotes and examples from Indo-Pacific countries) that will be designed and shared with decision-makers
- Multimedia assets (videos, infographics, podcasts, animations)
- Blog pieces or opinion articles
- Content for use in fact sheets, one-pagers, web content, and policy submissions.

Selection Criteria

To apply for the program, candidates should:

- Be at least 18 years of age, an Australian citizen and enrolled to vote
- Have plans to live in Australia from January 2024 to July 2024
- Be able to commit around 8-10 hours a month, noting that some months will be busier than others
- Have a demonstrated commitment to global health, human rights or international development.

You're at your best when you can be yourself. We want to ensure everyone's individuality and creativity can thrive. We encourage applications from First Nations Australians, people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, LGBTQI+ people and people with disabilities.

The Commitment

As a Global Health Fellow, your time in the program may look like this:

Frequency	Activity	Estimated time
Every few days	Catch up on messages and information shared among your project team, engage with other Fellows	2.5 hours each month
Monthly	In your own time, collect information and contribute to the development of advocacy material (research and writing)	2.5 hours each month
Monthly	Attend a Results Roundtable event	1.5 hours each month
Monthly	Attend a skill development and learning session	1.5 hours each month
Ongoing	Meet with your Fellowship project team	2 hours each month
Minimum time required each month		Around 8-10 hrs

In agreeing to take on this role, Fellows commit to:

- Remain in regular contact with the project team
- Attend at least 75% of calls and meetings
- Working together to produce deliverables for the project.

Fellowship Outline

The program is designed to strengthen skills in advocacy and policy. Through attendance at skill development and learning sessions and the completion of a project, Fellows will apply insights and knowledge of global health in a real-world advocacy context. Learning activities have been developed to help each Fellow achieve learning outcomes.

Fellows will take part in a series of skill development and learning sessions to increase knowledge on key aspects of policy influencing and campaigning, including:

- Understanding our global health architecture
- Writing for Advocacy
- Communicating complexity and elevator pitches
- Understanding Australia's political system
- Designing a campaign.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of the program, Fellows will have learned about:

- Insights and solutions for big global health problems from experts and organisations in Australia and around the world
- Ways to collect evidence, write an advocacy brief and communicate complex ideas
- How to use evidence to develop key messages, and adapt content for decision-makers in letters and campaigns
- The policy process in Australia and understand how decisions are made by MPs and senior officials
- How advocacy campaigns are designed and delivered.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Do I have to be an existing Results Advocate to apply for the Fellowship program?**

No, as long as you meet the eligibility criteria (outlined above) then you can apply! All existing Results Advocates are strongly encouraged to apply. The Fellowship Program is a great opportunity for Advocates to deepen their understanding of our campaigns and broaden their skills as a leader.

- **How will these skills and knowledge be helpful for my future career?**

Advocacy skills are useful in a range of careers, and the Fellowship will enable you to hone skills to communicate and influence. Advocacy skills are directly relevant for policy roles, campaigning, community organising, and a range of roles for international development. Fellows from the broader Results community in the US and Canada have gone on to work for the World Bank, in research, for consulting firms and in government and politics, and for other NGOs.

- **How much does this Fellowship cost?**

All Fellows who complete the program will be able to access a bursary of AUD 1200 in June 2024. Results will cover the costs of the program, including food, transport and accommodation for any travel you are asked to take during the Fellowship. Results will also cover the cost of registration fees at Conferences you are invited to attend, and pay for trainers and experts.

- **Do I need any experience to participate in the Fellowship?**

No. Your passion and commitment to the cause are more important than any existing experience or qualification. However, experiences in health, advocacy or social justice work will be helpful for you to undertake the program with other Fellows.

- **What does the application process involve?**

Applicants complete an online form and will be asked to provide an initial set of ideas about how to make the case for one of the two themes detailed above. We'd love to hear about your experience, hopes for the future, and how you like to learn and work with others. If shortlisted, you will be invited to attend an interview conducted over Zoom in December.

- **How do I apply?**
