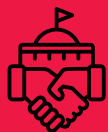




Global Context

Cross-Cutting Approach: Gender Equality Lens

Champion Multilateralism

Increase Federal Government participation in Australia's largest and most impactful multi-lateral health partnerships. Deepen long-term relationships to substantially reduce extreme poverty and increase human development outcomes.

Shape Systemic, Structural Global Health Policy Reforms

Influence significant policy changes through expanding and strengthening our influence, advocating for impactful, global poverty-reduction commitments.

Elevate the Impact of Emerging Climate Change and Health Impacts

Advocate for regional mitigation and adaptation initiatives through research-backed scenarios highlighting the devastating impact of climate change on global and regional health.

Strengthen grassroots advocacy

Our advocate network will be empowered to act as catalysts for political change, through targeted training and engagement to increase their knowledge, skills and motivation.

Expand parliamentary support

Grow our network of federal parliamentarians championing policy reform and resource mobilisation, cultivating cross-party relationships for sustained support.

Enhance public discourse influence

Shape the narrative around global health issues in media and policy discussions, highlighting the interconnections between health, poverty and gender equality.

Actively build partnerships

Build partnerships with values-aligned Asia-Pacific and/or First Nations organisations and representatives, ensuring our work is informed by experts and responds to the needs of those most impacted by the issues we work on.

- The Australian Government has contributed its 'fair share' to key multilateral organisations.
- The Australian Government has increased its funding for TB, and TB R&D.
- Results' advocates have played a vital role in the Safer World for All Campaign, calling on investment of 1% of the Federal Budget to Overseas Development Assistance.
- Australian parliamentarians are strong advocates and supporters of multilateralism.
- Results has added capacity to the national movement of organisations working on global health, climate and global poverty issues.
- Results and partners have effectively leveraged COP 31 to achieve strong outcomes on climate mitigation and adaptation, and climate justice.
